GUIDELINES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

Guru Nanak Journal of Sociology is a peer reviewed Journal, published biannually by the Guru Nanak Dev University. It accepts contributions on a wide range of topics in Sociology. Contributors are requested to submit papers between 5,000 to 8,000 words, (MS Word, 12 Font, Times New Roman, one and half space written on one side of the page) containing full text of the paper including abstract, notes, references, tables, charts and maps, if any. Any article sent to the Journal may not be simultaneously submitted for publication elsewhere, contributors are required to send a declaration to this effect.

Within the text, adopt the author-date method of citation by putting comma in between for example, (Beteille, 2002). If more than one work of an author is cited, separate the years of publication with a comma (Pandey, 1996, 1999). Separate the page numbers of citations by a colon (Shah, 2002: 2) and hyphenate the inclusive numbers (Shah, 2002: I-31).

Use single quotation marks while quoting sentences or a single word/phrase, and double quotation marks for use within single quotes, e.g., 'In the words of Delpit, the "womens' uestion" is today...Quotations of more than 50 words should be separated from the text and indented.

Use Universal 's' rather than 'z', in ise, ising, isation words. Use British rather than American spellings (colour, not color). Latitude is given to authors in italicisation and spellings, but these should be consistent in the paper.

Numerals from one to nine should be in words, and IO and above in figures. However the following should always be in figures (a) distance: 3 kms (b) age: 32 years old (c) percentage: 8 per cent (d) centuries: 13 th century (e) year:1800s.

Authors should provide their names, designations, official addresses and E-mail ID on a separate sheet. Manuscripts are accepted for publication on the understanding that they are subject to editorial revisions. Proofs will not be sent to the authors.

Authors are not paid any honorarium. They are supplied one copy of the issue in which their article appears as well as 25 reprints, lice of charge. Views expressed in all contributions are those of the authors, and not necessarily of the Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar Books for Review should be addressed to the Editor.
